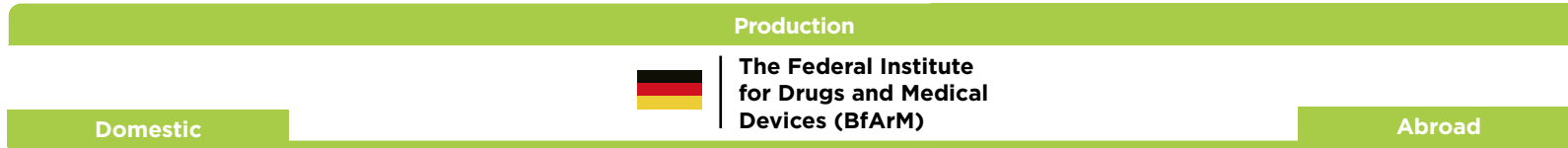


THE PATH TO MEDICAL CANNABIS: THE SUPPLY CHAIN



Oversees the production, harvesting, processing, storage, packaging and distribution of medical cannabis.

Cannabis Agency

Federal Opium Agency (BOPST)

Controls the import of medical cannabis:
- Distributes permits for narcotics.

1. Awards cultivation licenses for medical cannabis to companies through a public tender.
2. Retains possession of the medical cannabis after the harvest.
3. Distributes the medical cannabis to wholesalers and pharmacies.

Dried cannabis and extracts are imported to Germany from abroad (NL & CAN).



Import and Wholesale

Various national narcotic and drug permits and authorizations are required for international trade in medical cannabis. These are issued by the BfArM and the relevant state authority responsible for drug monitoring.

The following importeurs / wholesalers distribute dried cannabis / extracts from one or more of the eight foreign producers.

Pharmacy

The patient presents the cannabis prescription to a pharmacy. The pharmacy may not have the prescribed strain in stock due to the large number of available cannabis strains.



Pharmacists can order the cannabis strain from one of the twelve importers.



- Pharmacies must carry out the following steps.
1. Verify the narcotics prescription
 2. Identity check
 3. Prepare according to one of the NRF provisions (optional)
 4. Repackage
 5. Documentation
 6. Label
 7. Pricing
